Message from your President

April has arrived and with it the blossoms of spring. We can all look forward to warmer weather and the showers that will turn the

grass green and put the leaves back on the trees. It is also a special month for many of our residents as they celebrate Passover, a holiday that celebrates the Biblical story of the Israelites' escape from slavery in Egypt.

By the time you are reading this message, the work on the auditorium will almost be complete. Our hope is to be in building C by the end of the month. Our first action upon opening will be to return Bingo to its Monday evening venue. The Board is also planning a grand opening event and we will get that information out to everyone as soon as we have a date. I'm sure that everyone feels the same way the Board of Trustees feels – we can't wait to get into our auditorium and resume normal activities. It's been a long road, and your Board is very grateful for the patience and help that the members of our community extended during this period. Once again, the members of HCS came together during a crisis and pulled through it together.

The tent will be raised again at the beginning of the month and will support outdoor social events. The membership has expressed great delight at the tent raising and our hope is that we get to use it for many events in the upcoming months.

For those that were at the Homeowners meeting, it was announced that there are three seats available on the Board in this year's Trustee election. It was also announced by me that the recent federal law related to the Corporate Transparency Act had been overturned by the federal courts (that took place on March 1, 2024). This was brought to our attention at the Coalition meeting on March 7th by a representative from the Community Associations Institute (CAI). Recently, a member of our community advised us that

CAI notified him that on March 11, 2024, the federal government filed an appeal. The information provided states that CAI is requesting that community members contact Senator Menendez (D-NJ) who is a member of the Senate Banking Committee requesting support of a hearing to consider S.3625 - Protect Small Business and Prevent Illicit Financial Activity Act which proposes a one-year delay of the implementation of the Beneficial Ownership Information (BOI) reporting requirement under the CTA. I would implore everyone who can, to contact Senator Menendez's office (973-645-3030) requesting his support for bill S.3625. With this information in hand, I would also advise everyone who is considering candidacy this year, that if they are elected there is a possibility that they may have to comply with the requirements of the CTA. The requirements could include reporting of personal information allowing the federal government to track financial information and transactions if they so desire. As we get more information, we will update everyone, especially those running for the Board of Trustees.

An FYI for seniors regarding Social Security. As we all know the Social Security system is not in great shape, but to make matters worse the IRS has found it necessary to tax the income we all receive from Social Security. Without getting into the politics surrounding why this is happening, I'd like everyone to be aware of one individual who is trying to correct the way the system addresses Social Security. Minnesota Representative Angie Craig (D) has reintroduced legislation that would eliminate federal income taxes on Social Security benefits for seniors. It is called the "You Earned It, You Keep It Act" and was originally introduced in August of 2022. Components of the bill will increase funding for Social Security and extend the current life of the program an additional 20 years. "The bill is being praised as a win-win – it's a tax cut for seniors and a way to ensure more Americans can depend on Social Security benefits



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they have earned. And on top of that, it's fiscally responsible" Congresswoman Craig said in a recent statement. H.R.7084 - You Earned It, You Keep It Act was introduced in January during the 118th Congress (2023-2024). We will keep an eye on this bill and update everyone if there is any information or changes. If you're interested in following the bill online, you can do so by signing up at Congress.Gov.

TREES IN THE COMMUNITY

Recently we have had several severe storms. Many of us have had tree limbs and or trees fall. The rule of thumb regarding these fallen trees and/or tree limbs is simple. If a tree or tree limb(s) that are in the common area fall in the common area, we leave the downed tree and/or tree limbs where they fall, unless they are creating a hazard. If a tree or tree limbs from the common area fall onto a member's property, the association will remove them. If a tree and /or tree limb do damage to a homeowner's home, they will have to file through their homeowner's insurance for damages, but the association will have the tree and/or tree limbs removed. Also, if the downed tree and/or tree limbs from a tree are from one that stood on the homeowner's property or the township right of way, the homeowner has responsibility for any damage they may cause. This should clarify the association policy for downed trees and/or tree limbs. If a homeowner has a tree on their property and would like to have it removed and are not sure if that tree is on their property for sure, please call the Code Committee and have them come check on it before removing anything. Berkeley Township requires that you have a permit to remove trees.

NOTICE/CALL FOR CANDIDATES- HOLIDAY CITY SOUTH HOMEOWNERS CORP.

Dear Homeowner,

On the advice of our legal counsel, Becker & Poliakoff, LLP we will be following the provisions set forth in the Radburn Act which requires that we send out this "Call/Notice for Candidates" for the three seats that will become available on the Board of Trustees and be decided on our proposed election day, June 26, 2024. The exact day of the election is to be determined based on the Ocean County Board of Elections and their requirements based on the Presidential Primaries that are scheduled for this June.

Our Master Deed/Declaration (Covenants and Restrictions) and By-laws indicate that we are currently approaching our annual election period. The candidate(s) meeting(s) which allow candidates to speak to the members is held on the second Thursday of May (9th) and June (13th). The Homeowner's Meeting scheduled for those days will begin at 6:00 PM in the clubhouse. These meetings will be abbreviated business meetings in order to give the membership the opportunity to hear from the candidates vying for the three available seats on the Board of Trustees. The Election Committee will gather the data necessary to begin the election process and will oversee it in accordance with the timeline posted in the Southwind. *Voting will be permitted by mail-in & machine ballot*. The method used to count the ballots may change from last year. Thought has been given to having a firm that is certified under the constraints of the Radburn Act provide that service for the association.

For you to become a candidate, you must be in good standing (which means that any fees associated with your account must be paid in full prior to running for the Board of Trustees) and be a permanent resident for 9 months prior to the date of submission of nomination. The three (3) candidates with the most votes will serve on the Board of Trustees for three (3) year terms.

While the By-laws explain the powers and duties of the Board of Trustees, I would like to briefly highlight some of the responsibilities your Board of Trustees have, so that you may further understand the Trustee position and its importance to you as a homeowner. The Board of Trustees has the responsibility for the operation, care, upkeep and maintenance of the facilities, contract negotiation, insurance for the association and maintenance of reserve funds. Additionally, information gathered from reserve studies compiled by the association's engineering firm assists in preparation of the annual budget and is collated, then discussed with our Certified Public Accountant (CPA) to determine the associations financial standing. The Board is also responsible for adjusting or increasing any annual assessments and also calling for special assessments, as the Board deems necessary. These matters are discussed with our CPA, Legal Counsel and voted on by the members of the Board. There are also the many additional responsibilities concerning the daily operation of our homeowner's association. Our Board of Trustees is made up of homeowners who manage the Association's facilities and are fiduciarily responsible with the memberships best interest in mind. The current Board are all members of the Senior Coalition in Berkeley Township, HOA Leader and CAI (Community Association Institute). These are organizations that provide information on current and upcoming legislation and education in the managing of an HOA. To provide the best service to our community continuing education and awareness is part of the responsibility. If you are interested in becoming a candidate for the Board of Trustees, please see the form on the reverse side, fill it out and return it to the Clubhouse with a clear photo no later than 2:00 pm on 4/15/2024. There is a drop box inside or outside of building A or your documents can be emailed to doris@hcsnj.org.

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HOLIDAY CITY SOUTH HOMEOWNERS' ASSOCIATION MINUTES OF MEETING – March 14, 2024

Welcome all to the homeowners meeting of March 2024. Please stand for the pledge of allegiance. A special thank you to all the Veterans who have served and are currently serving. Let's take a moment of silence for those souls that were victims of the wars around the world and let's pray for the safety of our troops. If there are members dealing with illness or have passed, please let's keep them in our thoughts and prayers.

The meeting will be recorded and will be transcribed for submission to the Southwind.

The Chair will take roll call of attendance of the Board of Trustees: Adrian Corrigan, Rich Bohan (absent), Fran Hurley, Linda Hendricks, Vince DeChiaro, John Fay, and Mike Signorile are in attendance.

After the business portion of the meeting, the floor will be open to the membership for comments. Each member will be allowed two minutes to address the Board of Trustees. The sign-up sheet is on the table. I must remind everyone who wishes to speak that all questions or comments must be addressed to the Board in a civil manner, or they will not be entertained.

I will now move on to the business portion of the meeting.

The current treasurer's report: Operating Account is \$849,587.44 and the deferred Operating Account is \$439,289.02. The reserve account is \$752,855.07. A motion was made to accept the treasurer's report. All were in favor.

The minutes from the January 11, 2024, meeting as printed in the Southwind were approved and accepted. All were in favor.

Old Business: The restoration of the auditorium is underway, and repairs are on schedule. It is imperative that everyone understands that the area designated as Building C (construction area) is off limits to the membership. This is not only due to the potential hazards that are currently in place while we are under construction, but also because the insurance company is only providing us with builder's insurance during the construction period. Liability insurance will not kick in until we have an inspection and approval by our architect/engineer and a final inspection by the Township to close out the issued permits. No one can go into the building unless you have permission

from the Board of Trustees. The maintenance crew is different. They are allowed in and out because they are covered under our workman's compensation insurance. We want to thank everyone for their patience during the process. We all look forward to seeing the refurbished auditorium. The Trustees have been discussing the possibility of sponsoring an event for the grand reopening of the building.

New Business: There were no matters that require a vote today as we were only discussing the restoration of Building C and the work schedule. So, with that being said, I will close the business portion of the meeting. All were in favor.

John Fay: As Mike said, the building is moving along and according to their schedule. They are about 2 1/2 weeks ahead of what they had planned so everything's looking good and I'm hoping that we are in there by the end of May. Also, just to let you know, if you see somebody who is walking in the common ground behind your property, they are hunters looking for deer horns to lure deer. The police advised us about this, and you are to call them if you see this happening.

Mike: There's something I want to read from Rich Bohan. He sent this message to the Trustees and wanted everyone to know that he has lymphoma Stage 3. This cancer can be cured, and he couldn't be here today because he was having a chemo treatment. He plans to be back and ready for the meet and greet and the Trustee dance and anything else that needs to be taken care of. He said the next time you see him; he'll be a little thinner and probably have a little less hair. He sends his love to everybody. We spoke to him today and he sounded good, and he was just finishing his treatment, so we'll keep him in our prayers and hope that everything goes well for him.

I'm going to open up the floor to the clubs and committees for any announcement.

Alice Patrizio: I just wanted to inform everyone that Terry Capezio passed away the day before yesterday. Also, anyone going to Woodlock Pines or people that know someone who is going, April 15th is the deadline to pay for your trip. I called Richie and I talked to him this morning and I just wanted to say that for the past year he's been the liaison for the woman's club, and he was wonderful. He helped us in any way he

could. He was there every Friday to sign the activity sheets. He was really wonderful, and I hope and pray that everything goes well for him, and he'll be back soon with us.

Mike: I'm going to open up the floor to the membership.

Debbie Fazio: Hello everyone. I wanted to come tonight to speak about our upcoming Trustee Elections and, more specifically, about the right of each and every candidate to be heard by all residents during the duration of the campaign. There's basically four ways in which this information has been disseminated to us in the past - the Southwind book with the photo and a 250 word intro about yourself placed in one or two months before the election date and at a board meeting with speeches and are limited to 5 minutes of time with a possible limited number of questions and answers. Flyers that are written by the candidate and handed out by them usually with friends to help pass it around. Rallies are scheduled and organized by the candidate and our friends and are held in a residence's driveway and/or inside the person's home. The rallies are up to the individual candidate as to whether they would want to put forth that additional effort and cost. Many do because they haven't been given enough opportunity to expand on all their viewpoints that are in the Southwind or during the scheduled speech time at the meeting. In my opinion, the board should be in total support of giving the time and attention to the candidates and make it easy for them to share what their hopes are for the next three years. The residents deserve to hear it all. Let's make better use of our Southwind since it does go out to all 2,359 homes by allowing more than 250 words for each candidate. If there is not enough room in the book, will you consider removing for just one month possibly 2, the coloring page, the puzzle page, the fun and games, the joke section or even some monthly repetitive information that you can get from your previous books. Maybe we could even shorten the president's page and maybe if the clubs and other groups find it important enough, they may also be willing to just shorten their newsletter to make room for that one month to make room for some space that can be available for the candidates. This action by the board will affirm to all of us how much we value and respect what the candidates are saying, what they're expecting to accomplish, and what they stand for. Besides the Southwind, we should also give candidates more speaking time at our board meeting along with the ability to answer any and all questions as long as they're respectful to all parties. We are

here because we want to hear what they have to say, and we want to know how they feel about certain matters pertaining to our wanting to make better choices. You can hold a special meeting in the evening where residents come to listen and ask questions to the candidates only. This way all the people who are there are people who are interested. The amount of time depends on the number of candidates. This year we have 3 available positions and it's possible that all three trustees will seek re-election. Nobody knows yet, but these people are already known, and their three years of dedicated service is noted. Any new candidate would be required more time to speak on their own behalf. If some feel they don't need a lot of time or more words in the Southwind, they can choose to keep it short and simple but that's up to them. Each candidate has the option to have themselves heard and the voting residents the right to hear them despite what some may think, we don't just vote for our friends or people we know. We elect the candidate who we feel will make the best possible decision for all of us. One who speaks for the people. I strongly request that the board responds positively to this request and gives us the opportunity to make a more informed choice. When election time comes around, please note that by no means am I saying that the fun pages and the repetitive pages, the clubs, or group information or even the president's page is not important, but for just one month give the candidates the opportunity to share and allow us to make informed decisions.

Mike: Could you give me a copy of your requests so we can take a look at them and then maybe make some changes?

Bob Darwley: I have two questions. Who is our new insurance company?

Mike: It's still Philadelphia Insurance.

Bob Darwley: Are we going to sue the other insurance company?

Mike: No. Once you settle, you can't. If we had gone to court, then we would have and then what would happen was we would have received a monetary settlement for lawyer's fees and additional expenses. We didn't get to that point, and we settled out of court to get the money to do what we needed to do. Philadelphia is our insurance company right now and they are insuring this building and building B. There is a separate insurance policy on Building C and it's what they call builders insurance. That's why no one can go into that building. The only people that are covered in there are the people that are working in there. The contractors have to provide their own insurance on top of what we have.

Alice Luinenborg: I live on Buena Vista Drive. It is a bad road. There are bumps and holes and puddles. Do I ask you or do I go to Berkeley Township?

Mike: I guess you would have to ask me as a councilman. What I will do is I'll take a ride down there and then I can go to the Township and find out where your street is on the list for paving. They do have a list of when the roads are to be paved. I'm going to check with the town to find out where we sit with your road. There's only so many roads they do annually and that's because of the cost involved. I will find out where your street is on the list. Provide me with your email address so I can let you know.

Larry Puccio: I was reading in the paper the other day about the bus services that we offer. I saw how the prices have gone up drastically. Is that going to affect us or are we under contract for a while?

Mike: To be honest with you, they have not called us about the extension of the contract. We're going to keep running the bus the way it's running. When it comes time, my negotiator (Adrean) will be on the phone and hammer them. Bingo is going to be one of our first priorities to get back in the building. When we get back in, I want Larry to go in and test his equipment to make sure it's all working and we're up to snuff and we can you get the show on the road. We put a claim into the insurance company to compensate us for the loss of the bingo money, we received some funds, but it didn't cover all of it. It only covered part of our losses. The majority of the money that we have received is going back into the building. Once we get Bingo back, we can use the \$5000 a month that Bingo supplies the towards the bus service, but we have to build that up again.

Gail Sanzari: I have chaired the election committees for a few years. No one has ever come to me and asked for more time or had anything to say about what was going on with the election. Out of 2,356 homes, we have 800 people that vote. Let me say something more about what Debbie was speaking about. The reason why I canceled the mail-out ballots was because we lost \$8,000 one year, and \$10,000 the next year on postage. It was not working. I spoke to some people, and I asked, did you get your mail-in ballot? Some said, yes, but I threw it in the garbage.

Mike: I was on the phone with our attorney today and just found out that there's been some changes to the Radburn Act and also the way voting takes place, and they will be send it down to us. Even with the restraints that they put on us. We are falling right within the guidelines of how everything is supposed to be done, so it is working out really well for us. It's

communities like ours that pushed it. We tried to get away from this mandate to have the ballots mailed out to everybody and the cost that was involved was about \$8,000 if it was sent out correctly and it's another \$7,000 if you make a mistake. It just keeps adding up and that's our money being wasted.

In my article I put some information in there about becoming a candidate and about taking part in the process. According to the government there is something called the Corporate Transparency Act that was enacted. The courts found it in favor of the homeowners' associations and that it would be a violation of our rights. They put it on hold, and we are waiting to hear what's going to happen. Basically, what the court said was that the Federal Government was actually being too invasive when it came to the smaller communities such as ours. They just grouped us in there. We will wait to see what happens but right now it's on hold for any candidates that are going to move forward and want to participate. When the time comes in January, you may have to file with the government under the Corporate Transparency Ac, but right now this is on hold, and it's may not be necessary.

Question: Can you vote electronically?

You can do electronic balloting, but the only thing with electronic balloting is that you need to know that there is no anonymity. If you want to request an electronic ballot you can get it, but you have to realize that you're giving up your privacy. I looked into this, and I talked to people to get some information about it. They said that if you send your ballot in by e-mail, you should have a third separate party that looks at them. That's why we have an attorney there to review everything.

Question: What is the work that is being done on Santiago and Orlando?

Mike: JCP&L and their conglomerate group replaced wires on the roads all the way down to the end by St. Max. They are doing the same on Santiago and then down Orlando. Supposedly, they are replacing all the lines. The original wires were laid in the ground in the 1970s.

They're going to be replacing them with better and newer wires. Transformers are supposed to be replaced too, but the utility company is not giving us an estimate of when they're going to get this work done or how extensive it will be.

Question: Is there another push by the Assembly and Senate regarding the 55+ communities?

I watched the Senate and Assembly committees all the time to see what's going on and to make sure

that there's nothing that goes through. There are new bills that have been presented and they're going to keep trying every year, and we will keep an eye on it. If it comes out of the committee then we'll be doing petitions again. I'll be honest with you, we now have someone down there that has our best interest, and it is Senator Amato.

Anyone who is a veteran here can be brought by Uber over to the VA building. There's a new VA Facility which is slated to be open in July in Toms River and that's a real positive, for anything veteran related. Once the clinic opens up in Toms River it will be easier to get your medical needs.

Question: When will the new badging system be activated?

The girls worked really hard and did an excellent job in getting those bandages out. Right now, they are not activated. Missy is inputting all the badge numbers into the system. When we lock down the buildings, we'll advise you by email or robo call that the badge system is activated.

We are putting the tent back up the first week in April. We will be using the tent for gatherings and events. We're in the process of getting all the permits.

GARBAGE NOTICE

Garbage is **NOT** to be put out to the curb **before 4:00 PM on Mondays**. This is a Berkeley Township Ordinance and HCS residents must comply. Violators may be issued a fine for non-conformance by the Township and/or HCS. Trash receptacles must be kept in your garage, behind your home, or in an area out of view from the street. Receptacles must be covered and concealed. If you are away, consider having a friend or neighbor place your garbage cans at the curb and return them to their respective out-of-view locations after trash pickup.

With the outbreak of the COVID-19 virus, Berkeley Sanitation Department's rules for putting out trash is as follows: The Township has made key changes to trash pickup. All household trash must be bagged and placed in an outdoor trash receptacle. Sanitation employees will not pick up trash that is not bagged.

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

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

RECYCLING PICKUP

There have been many phone calls and emails regarding the pickup of recycling when the date for pickup falls on a holiday. The schedule that is provided by the Township states that recycling should be put out the Saturday before a Monday holiday. Discussion with the Township DPW supervisor provided us with information that should help with planning for the pickup of recycling when the schedule for pickup falls on a Monday holiday.

We were advised that when our recycling day is moved to another day due to a holiday, we are now on a pickup schedule with another section of the township which more than doubles the amount of recycling that will be picked up on that day.

With that thought in mind we need to understand the Township DPW will make every effort to pick up the recycling on the day denoted on the schedule. If they do not pick up your recycling by the end of the day on the scheduled day, please take your recycling in. This is an important step in the process. This will prevent recycling that is left out from getting blown around the neighborhood or ending up tangled in the swales and culverts on our common grounds. The DPW suggests that if your recycling does not get picked up on the scheduled day, we should put it out on the next regularly scheduled workday. In most cases that would be Tuesday, or Garbage pickup day. The DPW will continue to have recycling trucks making rounds until they are completely caught up and all the recycling is picked up.



If you have plans to do any repairs or renovations, please remember to do your due diligence when hiring a contractor. The Berkeley Township Web site has been completely updated and has many helpful points of information so that you protect yourself, the consumer. A few of the points given are:

TIPS FOR CONSUMERS

The Contractor must have a NJ Consumer Affairs Registration/License number and it should resemble this style number (#13VH12345600)

- **Contact Consumer Affairs to see if this NJ registration/license is good and if consumers have filed any complaints against the contractor and to ensure the contractor is registered.
- ** Get written estimates from at least three contractors.
- **Ask the contractors how long they have been in business, if they have liability insurance (as required by law), and whether they will be using subcontractors on the project.
- ** Contact the references your contractor gives you. Ask the referenced person whether the job was completed on time, whether there were any unexpected costs, whether the workers showed up on time and cleaned up when they finished, and whether they would use the contractor again.
- ** Ask your contractor about his or her professional affiliations and confirm the information with those organizations.
- ** Do not pay for the entire job up front. The customary arrangement is one-third in advance, one-third halfway through the job and one-third upon completion. Do not pay with cash.

KNOW THE LAW

Obtain a written contract. Contracts for home improvement projects costing \$500 or more must be written and must include the legal name and business address of the contractor as well as a start date, a completion date, a description of the work to be done, and the total price.




