TREES IN THE COMMUNITY

Recently we have had several severe storms. Many of us have had tree limbs and or trees fall. The rule of thumb regarding these fallen trees and/or tree limbs is simple. If a tree or tree limb(s) that are in the common area fall in the common area, we leave the downed tree and/or tree limbs where they fall, unless they are creating a hazard. If a tree or tree limbs from the common area fall onto a member's property, the association will remove them. If a tree and /or tree limb do damage to a homeowner's home, they will have to file through their homeowner's insurance for damages, but the association will have the tree and/or tree limbs removed. Also, if the downed tree and/or tree limbs from a tree are from one that stood on the homeowner's property or the township right of way, the homeowner has responsibility for any damage they may cause. This should clarify the association policy for downed trees and/or tree limbs. If a homeowner has a tree on their property and would like to have it removed and are not sure if that tree is on their property for sure, please call the Code Committee and have them come check on it before removing anything. Berkeley Township requires that you have a permit to remove trees.

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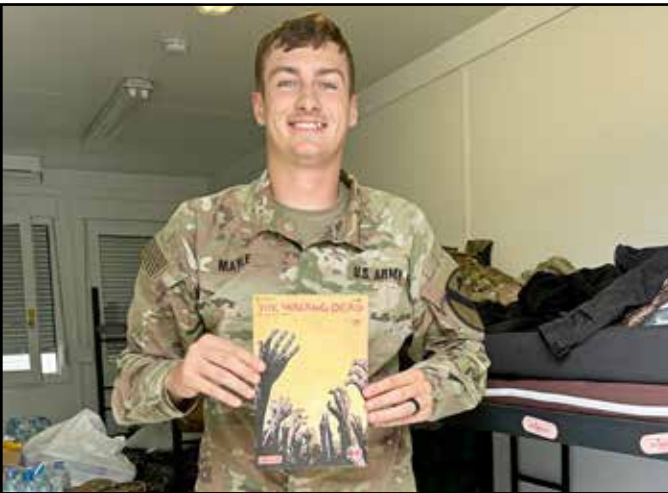

Homeowner Meeting – May 9, 2024

The following is a transcription of the meeting for the candidates with the agenda transcribed for the business portion of the meeting and minutes recorded:

Open meeting - Pledge of Allegiance/National Anthem

- A special thank you to all the Veterans who have served and are currently serving. We should not forget those men and women who are away from their loved ones, defending our constitutional rights. When we see a veteran, we should thank them for all they have given for us.
- Let's all take a moment of silence for those souls who have been victims of the violence and wars around the world. Let's also pray for the safety of our troops in those areas.
- If there are members dealing with illness or that have passed, please let's keep them in our thoughts and prayers.
- The meeting will be recorded then transcribed for submission to the Southwind.
- Chair will take a roll call attendance of the Board of Trustees – Adrian Corrigan (Absent), Rich Bohan (Absent), Fran Hurley, Linda Hendricks, Vince DeChiaro, John Fay & Mike Signorile. There are enough Board members present for a quorum.

After the business portion of the meeting the floor will be turned over to the Chairperson of the Election Committee and the members of the committee. The Election Committee will present this year's candidates to the membership.

We will now move to the monthly business meeting:

Current Treasurers' Financial Report. Motion to accept the treasurer's report as read. Motion made by Vince DiChiaro, Second by John Fay - All approved.

Minutes from the last homeowners meeting 4/11/2024 as printed in the Southwind. Motion to accept the treasurer's report as read. Motion made by Vince DiChiaro, Second by John Fay - All approved.

Old Business:

- The restoration of the auditorium is complete. The contractors have hired a cleaning company to start on cleaning and getting the Auditorium ready for our use. The hope is that it will be completed by this weekend. We have applied to the insurance company to replace the builder's insurance with the insurance package we cover all our buildings with. We are waiting for the declaration page to add to our current insurance policy. We are hoping to be in the building by the middle of May. Again, we want to thank everyone for their patience during this process.
- Legislative Matters: Petition is being signed for Social Security bill introduced in Congress. HR 7084. If you haven't signed, please do so, we will be getting the petitions to the Congresswoman who introduced the bill and those Congressmen who represent us.

New Business:

- Matters requiring a vote or voted on during executive session that are required to be brought to the floor and read into the minutes (requires roll call votes). There were no matters presented today that required a vote.

Do the Trustees have anything they would like to address?

Fran - Nothing

Vince – Vince spoke about the pool.

John – spoke about courtesy to each other and especially the office staff.

Rich & Adrian – not in attendance

With no other business to be discussed – there is a call for a motion to close the business portion of the meeting.

Due to the presentation of Candidates, we will not be opening the floor to the membership for comments or statements this evening. Please maintain a civil demeanor as we listen to your Candidates speak. I will now turn the meeting over to the Chairperson of the Election Committee, Gail Sanzari. The Chairperson and the Election Committee members will advise candidates and monitor the next portion of the meeting.

Gail: “The Election Committee is acting under the direction of Legal Counsel. This portion of the meeting is being conducted in conjunction with the rules found in the Holiday City South Homeowners Association “Candidate, Election, Ballot & Absentee Ballot Rules” and the Radburn Act. It is also subject to Robert’s Rules of Order.”

As I walked in tonight, I received this letter and it reads - To a person of the election committee, Tonight May 9th homeowners meeting is in the introduction of all the candidates running for Board of Trustee for the year of 2024. I’m Richie Bohan, I am one of those candidates. However, because of my recent diagnosis, I am undergoing chemo treatments and cannot be around large crowds of people. At this time, I would say that all my prayers and thoughts are with you all tonight that you have a successful and informative meeting. Thank you, Rich Bohan

The candidates will be allowed five minutes to speak. They will be timed by Gloria who has the time watch. The candidates will also speak at the next meeting in June, so we’ll be able to hear them another time.

Our first candidate will be **Joe Bushey:** Hi, my name is Joe Bushey and I’m running for the Board of Trustees. Thank you for coming out tonight to hear the candidates speak. Many of you may be looking at my face. You’ll be saying that’s not the guy in the Southwind. Well, I have, like anti-blurry cream tonight. Anyway. I’ve lived here for seven years with my wife. Diane, we love the community. We especially love using the pool. Love looking at the wildlife of our community. One of my good friends here asked me about a month or so ago. Joe, why do you want to be on the board? You have a nice life, you travel. Why do you want to put up with that aggravation? That’s a great question and I can only think of one answer and that is I know I can make this community a better place to live. Not to say that is a bad place, but I think I can do a better job. I want to be your voice. Many of you have great ideas. On how to contribute to community but don’t want the responsibility of being on the board. I want to hear those ideas. We need more involvement from our members to the community and more activities for all of us to enjoy. Volunteering is what makes this community run. The rightly like to thank all the people who help the clubs here. I also like to thank Mike our president and Vince of our Board of Trustee for listening to people like Mike Lorenzo and others who had the idea of movie night, I think that’s a great idea. My allergies are a little anyway. So some of you may know that I filled a vacancy on the board in 2019 to 2020. My intentions are the same now as they were then with the exception, that I know a lot more of how to run this community, and how not to do. We need regulations to be updated and clarified, we need to be enforced equally. As I said in the June 2024 Southwind, it doesn’t matter whether you’re 55 or 105. Everyone needs to be treated equally and with compassion and respect. When I say the rules need to be updated. For example, I’m not looking for anybody to park their RV in their back yard, just to be clear. We need to do away with the neighborhood tattletale requirement to enforce the rules. This does not create Harmony amongst neighbors, the code committee and the board should be the only ones responsible for the enforcement and the continuity of the rules. I also think that there needs to be more transparency from the board about finances. Including future expenditures. It’s all spelled out in the reserved study. So why not let people know ahead of time what this money is. So that the lack lack of transparency creates unnecessary questions, confusion and doubt amongst the community, This is especially true when talking about what happened repairs on Building C? When I talk about transparency, I’m going to give you a quick example from my own experience. I received an email that I had an outstanding fine. I had no idea what that could have been about and went to the office to clear it up and up. I had a fine and I had no idea about never sending the notice for a late hope before. And what I’m told, there were many people that have been notified. Now, they’ll find I’d like to know how that happens. Who’s been monitoring the office staff, and it just

shouldn't happen. And most of all, allow some Revenue because of the fines. In closing, we need positive change. I ask you to consider voting for me and any other candidates that are supporting change. Keep in mind, the three incumbents, when they ran in 2021, ran on a platform that they were going to cut the spending. And follow the year, your dues went up. Thanks again for attending and listening to me, showing interest in our community. I'll be in the back of the room after the meeting if anybody has any questions or would like to come and say hello, thank you.

John Fay: How you doing? My name is John Fey. I've lived here. 17 years. I believe in this community and have spent the last three on the board. For 13 years, I was on the code committee. I handled the 400 clubs as president, it's a great Club. By the way, I recommend you go look into shuffleboard and bocce. I spent years on the election board. I never wanted to be a trustee. In 2021 I saw that we were lacking volunteers. I also saw that money was running out the window. I was pretty sure it was being spent on frivolous things. That's not true. Far as a pool vote, it should have been closed at seven o'clock in the first place. Now I'm telling you. Now, I'm very sorry about it but there's no reason to keep it open to 10 o'clock at night in the spring or the fall. That's my opinion. That's the way I feel. If it's a case where waste any money, that's approximately over three thousand dollars a year. To have that pool open until 10 o'clock at night in the spring and in the fall. The summer I will argue that temperatures are higher allowing for 10 o'clock at night. But as far as the spring seven o'clock is fine allowing people to sit around and enjoy the pool. They're not in the water. You just want to enjoy the ambience. I enjoy sitting by the pool. That's my ticket. I don't mind spending money for quality items. It's your money and to my extent, that's the way I look at it. Thank you all, it's all up. Vote for whoever you think is right.

Okay, next we'll hear from **Debbie, Fazio:** Thankyou everyone for coming out tonight. I'd like to begin tonight by wishing Fran Hurley, Rich Bohan, John, Faye, Joe Boucher and Wayne Scagg, good luck in this upcoming trustee election. The job is a very big undertaking with a great deal of responsibilities and its impressive to see in Southwind June 2024 that so many are very willing and able to take it on. I lived in my house here in Holiday City, South for over 16 years. I actually bought while I was still employed as a special education teacher with the Brick school system and retired after 30 years of service. It was and still is a big part of who I am a job that was near and dear to my heart. After retiring, I became more involved here at our clubhouse. I love taking many of the bus trips participating in many activities and events, as well as attending most fundraises sponsored by the different clubs. I became more involved in joining as many of the clubs as possible and helping whenever and wherever they needed volunteers. Eventually I took on being the president of the social club. For one year, where the membership grew from over 200 to well, over 400 members, in just that one year after I stepped down, I continued to support and volunteer for the club by running all fundraising events. These events sold out with over 310 members and guests. The great night to remember the most fun I had while helping the social club was directing our lipsink shows receiving standing ovations every year. If I had to choose my greatest strength and aspect, it would have to be my ability to create and organize just about anything that needs to be accomplished. I can plan develop and execute almost any function or activity with the utmost precision and can just about guarantee, it's fully accepted with tools exercise results. Like come before you tonight with the excitement of a child and the ability of an experienced adult. Having served that the trustee in the past for two years during the pandemic I gave it my all making myself visible and available as much as possible and always trying to make decisions and vote the way the majority of the homeowners wanted. Promises, I will not make especially if they can't be kept. I will however promise you this to always stay loyal and to speak up on your behalf as well as to continue to support and focus. For what we as a community want. Knowing and fully understanding that, I can't do it alone that we need a board with members, that will all care what the residents want. Ones that put their own personal interest aside. You have the power to elect a board, which you believe will care and listen to its residents. Three candidates of your choosing will serve us for the next three years. Make it three that keep you informed. Ones who care about what you think and feel I learned so much those two years of service and I truly believe that I can be an even bigger asset to all of you now. During the two years as trustee. I plan to continue the support and serve the people who put me there. Really thank you.

Next we'll hear from **Fran Hurley**: Hello. My name is Fred Herley. It has been my privilege to serve Holiday City South as a Trustee and Officer of the Board for the past three years. My hope is to continue in this capacity for another term and work with the members of the Board to ensure Holiday City South remains affordable and the best association to live and retire in. Before I retired, my work experience was in the financial area which has proven to be an asset for me in my current position as Board Treasurer. Additionally, my experience in facilities management taught me to focus on contracts with the intent of reducing excessive spending. This has helped me coordinate efforts to make positive financial decisions with the other members of the Board. Past experience has also provided the opportunity to supervise construction projects on twenty-seven separate facilities projects, bringing them compliant with the American with Disabilities Act. As a Purchasing Manager, Procurement Specialist for Computershare (formally The Bank Of New York Mellon), I took an intricate role in a company that is a Global Leader in Asset and Securities Management located in thirty-four countries with over 40,000 employees. With my fellow Board members, we have faced and approached many tough decisions with optimism and positive thinking. This Board always remains positive and takes into consideration the well-being of the membership when making decisions that directly affect the membership. We should all remember that no one trustee possesses individual authority to make decisions. This is why it is so important that the Board, in its role, presents themselves as a unified body. We always take the time to review and make the best possible decisions for the community, keeping in mind our fiduciary role as Board Members elected by you, the membership. I am hoping that the information I have provided along with my desire to continue working with "your" Board of Trustees will encourage you to cast your vote for me in the upcoming election. NOTICE/CALL FOR CANDIDATES- HOLIDAY CITY SOUTH HOMEOWNERS CORP.

Dear Homeowner,

On the advice of our legal counsel, Becker & Poliakoff, LLP we will be following the provisions set forth in the Radburn Act which requires that we send out this "Call/Notice for Candidates" for the three seats that will become available on the Board of Trustees and be decided on our proposed election day, June 26, 2024. The exact day of the election is to be determined based on the Ocean County Board of Elections and their requirements based on the Presidential Primaries that are scheduled for this June.

Our Master Deed/Declaration (Covenants and Restrictions) and By-laws indicate that we are currently approaching our annual election period. The candidate(s) meeting(s) which allow candidates to speak to the members is held on the second Thursday of May (9th) and June (13th). The Homeowner's Meeting scheduled for those days will begin at 6:00 PM in the clubhouse. These meetings will be abbreviated business meetings in order to give the membership the opportunity to hear from the candidates vying for the three available seats on the Board of Trustees. The Election Committee will gather the data necessary to begin the election process and will oversee it in accordance with the timeline posted in the Southwind. ***Voting will be permitted by mail-in & machine ballot.*** The method used to count the ballots may change from last year. Thought has been given to having a firm that is certified under the constraints of the Radburn Act provide that service for the association.

For you to become a candidate, you must be in good standing (which means that any fees associated with your account must be paid in full prior to running for the Board of Trustees) and be a permanent resident for 9 months prior to the date of submission of nomination. The three (3) candidates with the most votes will serve on the Board of Trustees for three (3) year terms.

While the By-laws explain the powers and duties of the Board of Trustees, I would like to briefly highlight some of the responsibilities your Board of Trustees have, so that you may further understand the Trustee position and its importance to you as a homeowner. The Board of Trustees has the responsibility for the operation, care, upkeep and maintenance of the facilities, contract negotiation, insurance for the association and maintenance of reserve funds. Additionally, information gathered from reserve studies compiled by the association's engineering firm assists in preparation of the annual budget and is collated, then discussed with our Certified Public Accountant (CPA) to determine the association's financial standing. The Board is also responsible for adjusting or increasing any annual assessments and also calling for special assessments, as the Board deems necessary. These matters are discussed with our CPA, Legal Counsel and voted on by the members of the Board. There are also the many additional responsibilities concerning the daily operation of our homeowner's association. Our Board of Trustees is made up of homeowners who manage the Association's facilities and are fiduciarily responsible with the membership's best interest in mind. The current Board are all members of the Senior Coalition in Berkeley Township, HOA Leader and CAI (Community Association Institute). These are organizations that provide information on current and upcoming legislation and education in the managing of an HOA. To provide the best service to our community continuing education and awareness is part of the responsibility. If you are interested in becoming a candidate for the Board of Trustees, please see the form on the reverse side, fill it out and return it to the Clubhouse with a clear photo no later than 2:00 pm on 4/15/2024. There is a drop box inside or outside of building A or your documents can be emailed to doris@hcsnj.org.

If you are unable to vote in person on **Election Day - Tuesday, June 25, 2024**, you can request an absentee ballot or vote by email by following these procedures:

1. Call the clubhouse office at 732-341-8900 and request an absentee ballot. Once you are registered for an absentee ballot, you can either pick it up in person or request that it be mailed to you. If you pick the absentee ballot up at the office, you will be required to sign for it. If you request the ballot be sent in the mail, it will be mailed out on **June 5th**.
2. Voters can also request a ballot by emailing the office at election24@hcsnj.org including the requestor's (homeowner's) email address. Ballots will then be emailed to the requester (homeowner) for completion and submission. Completed ballots will be returned by email to election24@hcsnj.org. Please mark the return email subject line "**Completed Ballot**". It should be noted that ballots submitted by email will not have the same privacy as those that are mailed. (privacy is not guaranteed when voting by email).

Absentee ballots will be available on **June 5, 2024** at the clubhouse office, and need to be returned to the clubhouse office no later than **2:00 pm on June 19, 2024**, either in person, by mail or email. If returning your ballot by the USPS please place your name and address on the return envelope. This will give the Election Committee and Legal Counsel the ability to ensure the voting homeowner is eligible to vote. Any absentee ballots that are returned without identification of the homeowner on the outside of the envelope or on the ballot itself (if you chose to waive your voting privacy) will be discarded and not counted. If you choose to use an absentee ballot, make sure you follow the proper procedure to ensure your vote is counted.

Sprinkler system maintenance is the responsibility of individual homeowners. Sprinklers need to retract automatically and need to be installed below grade. Sprinkler damages to spray nozzles or heads hit because they are above grade and or not automatically retracting will not be repaired by the mowing contractor. Please, have irrigation system clocks set so all watering is completed by **8:30 AM daily**. If irrigation is running at time of cutting, that section of the lawn will be skipped until the next cutting cycle. If you have a issue with something that was **damaged** during the lawn cutting or some other issue, you must **call the office** and register a lawn complaint so the issue can be looked at and corrected.

Members do not own shares in the HOA but have an interest in the community property managed by the HOA.

- ❖ Pool hours are 9:00 am to 10:00 pm – All patrons must vacate the pool area by 9:55 pm
- ❖ All badge holders must sign in with pool monitor for admittance and badges must be available for inspection at all times.
- ❖ All persons must shower before entering the water.
- ❖ Any persons showing evidence of any communicable skin disease, sore, inflamed eyes, cold, nasal or ear discharge or if they are wearing bandages will be denied admission to the pool area.
- ❖ Do not enter the water if you are experiencing or recovering from diarrhea or have had any symptoms related to a gastrointestinal (stomach) disorder in the past seven (7) days.
- ❖ Children 4 to 18 years of age are permitted into the pool under supervision of an adult between the hours of 9:00 am and 1:00 pm daily. **No child will be permitted in the pool with diapers of any kind.**
- ❖ Children should be encouraged to use the restroom before entering the water. Accompanying adult should immediately report any accidents observed in the bathing waters to a pool monitor.
- ❖ No animals, with the exception of service dogs, will be permitted in the pool area.
- ❖ Long hair and bearded need to be tied up while using the pool. Hair bands are available at the pool monitor station.
- ❖ **No alcohol** of any kind will be permitted in or around the pool area. Drinks must be in a clear plastic container or an approved insulated/thermos container. Glass containers are **prohibited** in or around the pool area.
- ❖ Persons suspected of being under the influence of drugs or alcohol will be prohibited from entering the pool. Any person found to be drinking alcohol or under the influence of drugs while in the pool area will be escorted from the pool area and denied admittance for the remainder of the pool season.
- ❖ Food or snacks are not permitted in the pool area during the daytime hours. From 5:00 pm to closing, food and snacks are permitted.
- ❖ Conduct that endangers the safety and comfort of others is prohibited and could be cause for violators to be escorted from the pool area and denied admittance for the remainder of the pool season.
- ❖ Flotation devices, such as noodles (no longer than the size of the pool monitor's table) and children's water wings/swimmies are permitted in the pool. Any type of inflatable/blow-up tubes, rafts, flippers or swimming devices are not permitted in the pool.
- ❖ Only bathing suits are permitted in the pool. Cut-offs, street clothes or substitute swimwear are not allowed to be worn in the pool.
- ❖ For safety, and as a courtesy to others, please place footwear along the edge of the pool, but not near or around the handrails used to entering or exiting the pool.
- ❖ No smoking or vaping will be allowed by the picnic tables or in the pool area.
- ❖ The pool will be closed, at the discretion of the pool staff or the Trustees, during inclement weather or emergencies.

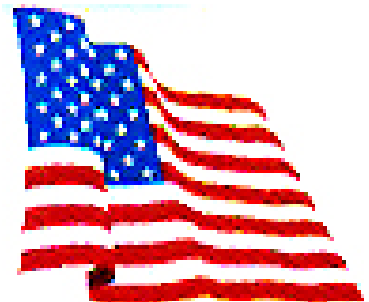
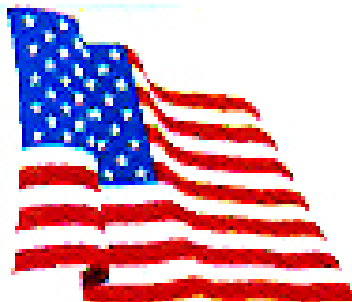
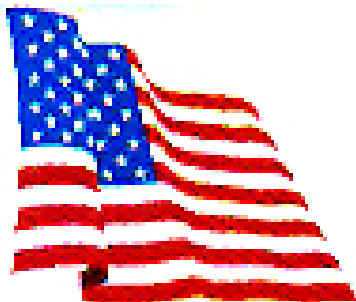

RADIO CLUB

Fox Hunt

The Holiday City Amateur Radio Club participated in their quarterly Fox Hunt. One of the members of the club goes out and hides. The fox is generally 5 to 10 miles away from the clubhouse. The idea is for the remaining members to triangulate on the fox and try to find him. There were two groups with directional antennas. We started from the clubhouse parking lot and took direction headings. Our direction headings told us that the fox was somewhere south of the club house. We then drove down Davenport Rd to the junction with Dover Rd and took another reading. This time it appeared he was southwest. We continued to the junction of Dover Rd and Pinewald Keswick Rd and stopped to take another reading. At this point, the reading takes us southwest and again we travel west to the junction of Dover Rd and Mule RD. Taking another reading we headed south towards the airport. At the airport we took another reading and spotted the fox near the dog run.

This practice gives us training to be able to actually go into the woods to find someone who is lost. We did this a few years ago when an elderly gentleman got confused and wandered into the woods.

Another emergency activity the club had participated in was during Hurricane Sandy when many people were displaced from their homes and had to stay in shelters. As power was lost cell phones did not work. We set up our antenna, transmitter and receiver at the Toms River North High School and provided communications between the people staying there and family members so they could let them know they were okay. Other ham radio clubs were located in the office of Emergency Management and a high school in southern New Jersey.

In June we will be participating in a United States Field Day event. This is where clubs go out to a field location and set up transmitters, receivers, antennas, and a generator for power. This exercise prepares us to be able to provide communications when disasters strike.

In emergency situations one of the most important services that Ham Radio provides to society is reliable communications.

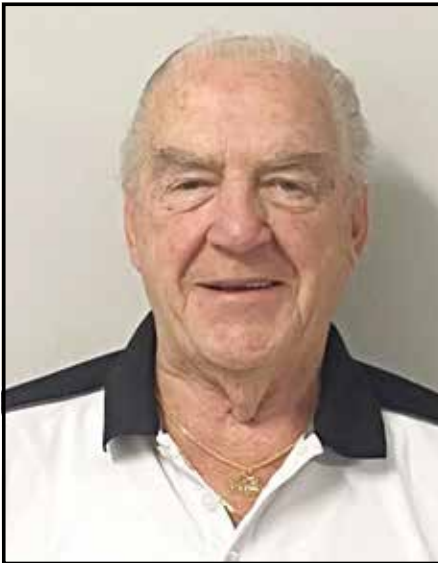

Violators may be issued a fine for non-conformance by the Township and/or HCS. Trash receptacles must be kept in your garage, behind your home, or in an area out of view from the street. Receptacles must be covered and concealed. If you are away, consider having a friend or neighbor place your garbage cans at the curb and return them to their respective out-of-view locations after trash pickup.

Discussion with the Township DPW supervisor provided us with information that should help with planning for the pickup of recycling when the schedule for pickup falls on a Monday holiday.

We were advised that when our recycling day is moved to another day due to a holiday, we are now on a pickup schedule with another section of the township which more than doubles the amount of recycling that will be picked up on that day.

With that thought in mind we need to understand the Township DPW will make every effort to pick up the recycling on the day denoted on the schedule. ***If they do not pick up your recycling by the end of the day on the scheduled day, please take your recycling in.*** This is an important step in the process. This will prevent recycling that is left out from getting blown around the neighborhood or ending up tangled in the swales and culverts on our common grounds. ***The DPW suggests that if your recycling does not get picked up on the scheduled day, we should put it out on the next regularly scheduled workday.*** In most cases that would be Tuesday, or Garbage pickup day. The DPW will continue to have recycling trucks making rounds until they are completely caught up and all the recycling is picked up.

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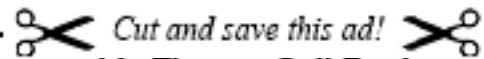

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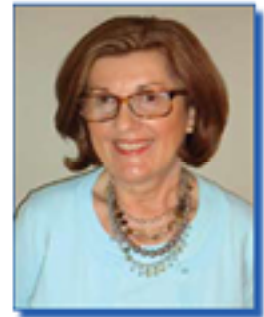
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
